Task 1	Manage conflict  Interpret the source and stage of the conflict  Analyze the context for the conflict  Evaluate/recommend/reconcile the appropriate conflict resolution solution
Task 2	Lead a team  Set a clear vision and mission  Support diversity and inclusion (e.g., behavior types, thought process)  Value servant leadership (e.g., relate the tenets of servant leadership to the team)  Determine an appropriate leadership style (e.g., directive, collaborative)  Inspire, motivate, and influence team members/stakeholders (e.g., team contract, social contract, reward system)  Analyze team members and stakeholders' influence  Distinguish various options to lead various team members and stakeholders
Task 3	Support team performance
Task 4	Organize around team strengths     Support team task accountability     Evaluate demonstration of task accountability     Determine and bestow level(s) of decision-making authority

# **Question Types**






- Situational
- Five (5) question types
- Click on a chart -- "hotspot"
- Fill in the blank
- "Drag and drop"
- Multiple right answers
- Most questions are traditional "one right answer"


# **Question Styles**







- Industry neutral
- 50% of questions related to next steps
- Measuring applicable knowledge to real life scenarios
- Wear your PMP exam hat, but real life still makes sense



- Not many full formula related questions
- Trick questions about EVM and Critical Path

# **Agile**





- 50% of questions are Agile related
- How to transition from Predictive to Agile
- Predictive process groups relate to the Scrum
- Conflict management, motivation issues, team development
- Scrum ceremonies, team roles and responsibilities
- Comparing Predictive vs. Agile
- Minimum Viable Product (MVP) and Definition of Done (DoD)
- Scrum, Kanban, Leadership styles and Agile implementation

- Pearson VUE testing centers (Covid-19 CDC)
- Location of testing center
- Take your exam early in the day!
- Login early for Online proctored version
- Do not use a work laptop for the PMP exam
- Online vs. Testing Center

# **PMP Exam Experience**





- 180 questions in 230 minutes.
- 10-min breaks in addition to the 230 minutes
- Breaks are not mandatory
- Cannot go back to a previous section once submitted
- Time management skills (60 seconds per question)
- Do not cram at the last minute!
- Score "early wins"
- Pearson VUE's whiteboard (Online version)



# **Strategy**






- Read every question and possible answers Read the Full Question!
- Identify keywords: "Best", "Next", "Most Likely", "Least Likely"
- Exam is about solving problems and fixing issues with people and plans.
- Follow your plan but be ready to be agile!

#### TIPS:

- Decide between taking the exam at a testing center or from home
- Work on your time management skills for the exam using the PMP simulator
- Develop your own plan for the exam.
